What? Finding a Song in a Story for PK, K, 1st Grade Teachers, Title Teachers, Music Teachers and School Librarians

This workshop is designed to follow last year's introductory workshop entitled "Finding the Beat" (in books). New participants are welcome and encouraged to attend! This upbeat workshop focuses on finding the song in a story. Participants will be led through several lesson plans that explore elements of music within the text of a book such as steady beat and musical forms such as echo, call & response, and verse-chorus. Teachers will also have the opportunity to apply these new strategies as participants are guided through the process of creating a Sing Me a Story lesson. Teaching teams that include classroom teachers, reading specialists, and music specialists are encouraged to attend. No previous musical experience is needed to participate.
